Most of the children, Bible students, and pastors that we work with have come from various backgrounds and different religious mindsets and some have had terrible experiences. Our staff wants to let them know and give them the understanding that God is good. It is God's desire that the goodness of God is not just a theological statement but something we can experience. The Christmas season is one of the best times for us to make known the 'goodness of God.' Meals for children, as well as simple gifts and meals for poor families in our area, are a great opportunity to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Everything that God created, He said is 'blessed and good.' We want to reflect the goodness of God in all that we do. We want the peoples of Burma to 'taste and see that the Lord is good.'

CHILDREN'S HOME: The children and the Bible students are working on a new project. We are putting up a new living quarters for a new member of our staff. The building will be in one of the corners where we once had the old kitchen facility. Our work in Burma required adding another staff member with his family. Pastor Philip has planted two different churches over the past year and will be a wonderful addition to the Children's Home and the Bible school. Philip will be a good Bible teacher for the students.

**FOOD PROJECT:** Our food project is one of the most important activities that we have going on with our work. Currently, we have fish, chickens (some are egg laying hens) and pigs, along with corn, beans, potatoes, ginger, and fruit trees. This certainly helps us with our food costs but also it gives the children some agricultural tools for their future.
